What does the funder want to know?

If you had a \$1m to give away, how would you decide who to give it to?

- What criteria would you use?
- What would you want to know?
- Who is going to benefit
- Who are you partnering with? Are you maximizing capacity for greater impact?
- Trackrecord/ previous record of managing large grants/ results
- Sustainability after grant is done
- What are you going to do?
- What outcomes are you going to achieve?
- History of working with community are you a carpetbagger do they have credibility?
- Regarding community forestry have you helped CREATE sustainability projects?
- Budget narrative how will the money be used?!
- Staffing requirements connects with budget do they have staff? Need to add, etc.
- Do any parts of the project need to be outsourced/ role of partners



- Target Demographic
- Organizational Background & Capacity
- Goals & Objectives
- Implementation Plan/ Activities
- Evaluation Plan
- Timeline
- Budget & Budget Narrative




Create Your Own Outline!
