Anatomy of the Grant Process

- Discovery process
- Creating the outline
- Completing the task list
- Assigning tasks
- Drafting the initial narrative content
- Gathering required documents
- Writing initial narrative content
- Editing the narrative content
- Developing the budget, etc.

Process Handout



Discovery Process -

when do you work on your own... when by yourself?

Self-work

- Gather information talk to key people inside and outside of organization
- Setup interviews
- Record what I know first, do initial assessment before reaching out to my team
- Identify decision maker, and setup meeting before doing too much
- Disseminate general information to the team so they know they have opportunity to give FB

In a team

- Interviewing other people get their buy-in, get their expertise
- Get core info from team
- Have conversation with decision maker (i.e., exec director)

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Assigning Tasks

Self-work

- Create task list preliminary
- Think through some of the hard/boring things to make lift lighter for others

With help of team

- Allow people on team to make adjustments (don't present task list as a "done deal")
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Editing the Narrative Content

Self-work

Set norms for participating in the creation process, specifically with google doc usage

Team work

- Utilize googledocs
- Leo uses <u>Workflowy.com</u> (sharing, comments, tagging, etc.)
- On Google Docs: use suggesting mode for all other contributors
- Communicate norms for contributing at the onset
- <u>Trello.com</u> (suggested by Cemelli)

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Create a Workflow

- How do you get them involved?
- What is your process?
- Your tech tools?
- What are your methods of follow-up?


Workflow Example

- Be kind during the critiquing process





