S = Specific

M = Measurable

A = Achievable or Attainable

R = Realistic or Rational

T = Timebound













Do: Set real numbers with real deadlines.

Don't: Say, "I want more visitors." Do: Make sure your goal is trackable.

Don't: Hide behind buzzwords like, "brand engagement," or, "social influence." Do: Work towards a goal that is challenging, but possible.

Don't: Try to take over the world in one night. Do: Be honest with yourself- you know what you and your team are capable of.

Don't: Forget any hurdles you may have to overcome. Do: Give yourself a deadline.

Don't: Keep pushing towards a goal you might hit, "some day."



By the end of 2024, we will eliminate homelessness in America through our comprehensive 10-month career support program located in our centers in Los Angeles, Boston, Miami, and Chicago.





We will provide financial planning skill workshops to 50 youth in Frankfort, KY so that they are equipped with the skills to support themselves.





By 2030, after completing our three-part health program, the 420 youth in our Harrisburg, VA initiative will no longer face any health challenges in their lives.





As a result of our awareness campaign and rebate initiative, by the end of 2023, all of Southern California homes will be outfitted with solar panels.

SMART goals and objectives for hypothetical:

- GOAL: Org XYZ will, by end of 2024, install 50 monitoring stations, with data collected 3 times per week by community volunteers
- GOAL: Org XYZ will train community members to advocate on their own behalf
 - Objective 2: by hosting 20 trainings over the next year engaging 200 residents so they can have skills to meet with elected officials and push for change
 - Objective 1: Residents put their training to work and have meetings with officials
- GOAL: Get polluters to change their behavior by emitting xxx tons/year less pollution
 - Analyze data from air quality monitors
 - Citizens file 53 complaints against the permit-limit that governs the plant
 - Initiate media campaign to SHAME the polluters and to present the resulting data/reports to decision makers
 - Local decision makers enact at least one policy change at an appropriate level to influence the plant (source of pollution)


