



## Lesson 5A2: Peer Interview Assessment

- “X” indicates that your peer-interviewer adequately fulfilled the criteria during the interview
- “NA” indicates that criteria was not applicable
- Leave the Result field blank if the interviewer needs improvement in this area

Criteria	Comments	Result
Example Criteria 1	Good job!	X
Example Criteria 2	Oops, you forgot to ask	NA
Asked questions/engaged in conversation to develop a rapport		
Followed up initial questions with additional questions		
Used paraphrasing/mirroring as a tool to ensure comprehension		
Interjected, as necessary, to redirect the conversation		
Sounded engaged and interested		
Invoked personal experiences to create context connection		
Asked questions about a broad array of topics		
Covered all relevant topics		
Asked questions to ascertain quantifiable information		
Asked questions (e.g., about sources) for substantiation purposes		
Asked questions to understand <i>why</i> this is important to you/the organization		
Asked questions to understand <i>why</i> this is important to the community		
Asked questions to understand the process (as relevant to the story)		
Took notes during the interview		
Asked about other key people/partners, if relevant		
Through conversation, demonstrated a sound understanding of the topic, as explained by you (the interviewee)
